COLONEL LESLIE S. HADLEY

Colonel Leslie S. Hadley is Vice Commander of the 403d Wing, Air Force Reserve Command, Keesler Air Force Base, Miss. The 403rd Wing is the first U.S. Air Force organization to acquire the C-130J Super Hercules and has executed over 90,000 flying hours in this weapon system. It is the largest tenant unit on Keesler AFB, with more than 1,600 reservists and 20 C-130J aircraft. The wing's mission is to train, equip and employ airlift forces in global support of the nation's interests. This includes tactical air-land and air-drop of personnel, supplies and equipment, aeromedical evacuation and agile combat support. In addition, the wing performs the only aerial weather reconnaissance mission in the Department of Defense.

Colonel Hadley entered the U.S. Air Force in 1990 after graduating from the United States Air Force Academy. She commanded the 919th Special Operations Support Squadron and the 711th Special Operations Squadron at Eglin Air Force Base Field 3, Fla. She has held key staff and operational positions at Headquarters Air Force, Air Force Special Operations Command and Air Combat Command. Prior to her current assignment, Colonel Hadley was the Individual Mobilization Augmentee to Director, Air Force Reserve Plans, Programs, and Requirements, Headquarters U.S. Air Force, the



Pentagon, Arlington, Va. Colonel Hadley is a command pilot and Combat Aviation Advisor with more than 4,000 flying hours in T-37, T-38, T-1A, KC-135R, RC-135 U/V/W, C-130E, MC-130E, MC-130P, and C-145A aircraft. She has flown over 1,300 combat and combat support hours supporting Operations Decisive/Joint Endeavor, Southern Watch, Allied Force, Desert Fox, and Iraqi Freedom.
