- The projected publication(s) or air times.
- If the product will be online, then please provide a link to the website on which it will be published, and any links to social media sites.

<u>Important:</u> If your media outlet is located outside of the United States, the approval process may take longer and the person requesting to fly will need to submit a visa and passport information as part of the approval process.

Please be aware that any media outlets interested in flying an upcoming or active storm mission should contact PA immediately, as slots fill up quickly. <u>All</u> media must be cleared prior to flying with the U.S. Air Force Reserve 53rd Weather Reconnaissance Squadron. Up to three media outlets may fly at a time, with a limit of two people per media outlet.

Storm missions are not pre-planned and are always a short-notice tasking; therefore, as the public affairs office is notified, media will be notified. This could occur with as little as 8-hour notice and as much as 16 to 18-hour notice. Some storms flown on the Pacific side may have up to 24-hour notice.

To film a training (non-storm) flight, please allow up to 30 days for coordination.
